### LEAF COLLECTION SEASON IS OCTOBER 13, 2025 - FEBRUARY 13, 2026





NO BAGS

LOOSE AT CURB FOR COLLECTION

During leaf season, leaves are picked up at least twice per month. However, during peak times (the Week of Thanksgiving through New Year), EXPECT DELAYS.

As the leaves begin to fall, the City of Gastonia's crews are hard at work keeping our streets clear and neighborhoods looking their best. To help make the collection process smoother and more efficient this season, residents can take a few simple steps to assist our crews and ensure leaves are picked up as quickly as possible.

#### What can you do during leaf season to help?

- Rake leaves into a loose pile at the curb please do not bag your leaves.
- Keep leaf piles separate from branches, twigs, and other yard debris or household garbage.

**Using a yard waste cart?** Leaves placed in a yard waste cart will be collected on your regular garbage/yard waste collection day.

**Want to drop them off?** You can take your leaves to the Duke Street Resource Center free of charge.

#### Want to know when your leaves will be picked up?

You can now track collection progress in real time using the City's interactive <u>leaf</u> <u>collection map</u> or by checking the WasteWise app. Just click the link to see when crews will be in your area!

#### **COMMUNITY QUICK TIP**

Streetlights play a big role in keeping our neighborhoods safe, welcoming, and easy to navigate at night. Occasionally, a streetlight or security light may stop working properly. It might flicker, stay on during the day, or go out completely. When this happens, the City of Gastonia's Electric Utilities Department steps in to make repairs or replacements at no cost to the customer.

Your help can make a big difference! If you notice a malfunctioning light, please take a moment to report it so crews can respond quickly. The process is simple and only takes a minute:

- Online: Fill out the <u>Streetlight Report Submission Form</u> to share the location and details of the issue.
- By phone: Call Emily Hicks with the City of Gastonia Electric Utilities Department at 704-866-6826

When reporting, it's helpful to include the nearest address or pole number (if visible), along with a brief description of the problem—such as "light flickering," "out completely," or "stays on during the day."

By taking a moment to report streetlight issues, you're helping to keep our community safer and brighter for everyone—whether it's lighting the way for evening walkers, improving visibility for drivers, or adding a sense of security for neighbors.



### STAY SAFE WHEN BUYING AND SELLING ONLINE: USE THE INTERNET EXCHANGE ZONE



With the holiday season approaching, many people are turning to online platforms like Facebook Marketplace, Craigslist, or local buy/sell groups to find great deals or unique gifts. While these transactions can be convenient, they also come with some risks, especially when it comes to meeting strangers in person.

To help keep residents safe, the City of Gastonia Police Department has established an Internet Exchange Zone located in two designated parking spaces in front of the Police Department at 200 E. Long Avenue.

This area provides a safe, well-lit, and monitored location for completing online transactions. The Internet Exchange Zone is under 24-hour video surveillance (recorded on a 14-day loop) and is clearly marked with signage that includes both emergency and non-emergency contact numbers.

Whether you're buying a gift, selling household items, or meeting someone for a simple exchange, the Internet Exchange Zone helps you avoid potential scams or crimes such as non-payment. It's a small step that can make a big difference in ensuring your safety and peace of mind.

As online shopping and secondhand exchanges pick up during the holidays, remember — safety first! Always meet in public, bring a friend when possible, and take advantage of this city resource designed to help protect you and your community.

#### A.C.E. MATCHING GRANT OPPORTUNITY

One of the many benefits of becoming a formally Recognized Community through the Alliance for Community Enrichment (A.C.E.) Program is the opportunity to apply for matching grant funds from the City of Gastonia. These funds can be used in a variety of ways to support projects that enhance and strengthen neighborhoods across the city.

The A.C.E. Matching Grant Program is designed for Recognized Communities that have been officially recognized for six months or more. Eligible neighborhoods can apply for additional funding to support projects focused on:

- **Physical improvement**s such as landscaping, signage, or beautification projects.
- **Neighborhood identity** efforts that help build a sense of pride and place.
- Public safety initiatives that promote a safer, more connected community.
- Environmental projects like cleanups, green spaces, or sustainability efforts.
- Community building events that bring neighbors together and encourage collaboration.



The goal of this program is to encourage and support neighborhood self-improvement. By offering matching funds, the City provides an incentive for communities to raise their own funds, build partnerships, and engage residents in making positive changes. These projects not only improve physical spaces but also strengthen connections and pride among neighbors.

**Do NOT** have items like batteries, thumb drives, or CD's in your boxes, they can break the machine


Do NOT have items in plastic bags




