Mission Statement

The Laurel East Community Watch works to improve the quality of our community by advocating for our neighborhood and building supportive relationships among our residents.

Our History & Activities

Since 2009, the Laurel East Community Watch has been meeting on the first Monday of the month at Sherwood Elementary School, except for July. We gather for an hour for a police report, a neighborhood discussion, and a presentation by community leaders on such topics as Code Enforcement and City Services, Master Gardeners, Animal Care & Enforcement, the Farmers Market, the Schiele Museum. Kintegra Health, and the County Library. The Watch also sponsors an annual Candidates Forum, a Christmas social and luminary event, has donated funds and made campus improvements at Sherwood Elementary School, and advocated for greater traffic safety in our neighborhood. Our Steering

Committee plans and conducts meetings and special events and communicates with over 300 members through e-mail and Facebook.
Since 2022 our Watch has been a Recognized Community by the City of Gastonia's Alliance for Community Enrichment (A.C.E.) Program so we receive special grant opportunities, stronger communications with City departments, and enhanced support from A.C.E. staff.

Building Great Relationships

The strength of a neighborhood is its residents. In Laurel East, we truly have great neighbors – people who care about others' wellbeing, safety, and property. The basis of this success is the Golden Rule: we treat our neighbors as we want to be treated. Here are some of the ways we try to promote a sense of community:

- We encourage friendliness and common courtesy. We speak or wave when we see one another and we welcome new neighbors.
- We help each other. For example, if a neighbor is going out of town, we offer to pick up their mail and newspapers. This is a great way to build and maintain strong relationships.
- We look out for the safety and security of our neighbors. We observe the neighborhood and school zone speed limits and watch for children on our streets. We report unusual activity by calling 704-866-3300.

- We respect one another's right to a peaceful neighborhood. While we all have different schedules and tolerance levels for activity and noise, we are considerate of neighbors when using noisy power equipment such as lawn mowers, leaf blowers, pressure washers, etc., or when operating unusually loud vehicles. When possible, we limit the use of these kinds of equipment or vehicles to daylight or early evening hours. Likewise, we respect that some of our neighbors may also be disturbed by loud voices, music, and barking dogs.
- We encourage open and respectful communication about common concerns. If there is an issue between you and a neighbor, approach them politely to discuss the situation. Explain how the situation affects you and ask how the two of you can come up with a solution that works for both of you. For example, if your neighbor's dog's barking annoys you, let them know and ask how the situation might be remedied to everyone's satisfaction. We believe the keys to negotiating these sensitive situations are respect for one another, communication. and seeking mutually agreeable solutions.
- We observe leash laws. Gaston County requires all dogs to be kept in a fenced yard or on a leash when outdoors.
- We work to preserve the beauty of our neighborhood. We are fortunate to have both naturally beautiful surroundings and



neighbors who work to maintain the attractiveness of their homes. We ask for your help in keeping our neighborhood attractive by removing your trash and recycling bins from the street the day they are emptied, helping to keep our storm drains clear of debris, and keeping your lawn maintained regularly.



Directory of Resources

Garbage

The City of Gastonia picks up garbage once a week. It provides a 96-gallon container to each home for \$11 a month. Put your trash in plastic bags, put them in the container, and close the lid without overloading the bin; do not put hazardous materials in the container. Place your bin at the curb by 7 a.m. on collection day, with the lid opening facing the street. Make sure it is clear on all sides and away from trees, mailboxes, parked cars, and fences. After pickup, move your container from the curb by midnight of collection day. For information on garbage pickup and special collection services for disabled individuals, call the City of Gastonia Solid Waste Division at 704/866-6714; for information on hazardous waste collections, call the County Recycling Hotline 704/922-7729.

Yard Waste

From October 15 to February 15 the city will vacuum your leaves at no charge; put them on the curb but not in the street or over a storm drain. The rest of the year you'll need to pay \$25 for each special leaf collection or put your leaves in a special 95-gallon yard waste cart you can buy from the city for \$60 (call 704-866-6774) and they'll be collected as yard waste.

The city also picks up grass clippings, small branches, tree limbs that are less than five feet long and four inches in diameter, and other yard waste on your regular garbage pick-up day. You are responsible for hauling construction or remodeling materials to a county dump site, which are listed here: www.gastongov.com/departments/solid-waste/garbage-disposal.

Trees

The City of Gastonia is a designated Tree City by the National

Arbor Day Foundation. The City will trim tree limbs on street rights-

of-way and the City Arborist will evaluate trees on City property and City rights-of-way that may pose safety hazards or sight problems at street intersections. To report tree limbs overhanging electrical lines or request an inspection from the City Arborist, call 704-866-6714.



Animal Care & Enforcement

This Gaston County program enhances the

safety of county residents from animals and works to ensure the proper care and treatment of animals. Animal Care and Enforcement impounds and cares for stray, diseased, injured, and unwanted animals at the Animal Shelter, where they are properly housed and cared for until owners reclaim them, they are placed through the Adoption-Medical Program, or as a last resort are euthanized. Schiele Museum

Parks and Recreation in our Area

The Avon and Catawba

Creek Greenway is a 2.7-mile, handicapped-accessible, paved trail. It is open daily to joggers, walkers, skaters, and cyclists from dawn to dusk. For more information: https://www.carolinathreadtrailmap.org/ trails/trail/catawba-creek-greenway.

Lineberger Park, features 18.5 acres of beautiful land featuring: three picnic shelters; a miniature train amusement ride; a lighted outdoor basketball court; an outdoor pool with a sprayground, pool house with showers, dressing space, and restrooms; and a concession area. The park is also linked to paved walking trails and is adjacent to the Avon and Catawba Creek Greenway.

Sherwood Elementary School has a quarter-mile track open to joggers and walkers after school hours. It is located at 1744 Dixon Road.

Within a mile of our neighborhood is the city-managed Catawba Creek Golf Course, a par 70, 18-hole course with a driving range, practice putting green, and a clubhouse with a pro shop. It is located at 530 Niblick Drive (704-866-6945).



Gaston County Public Library

The main branch of the Gaston County Public

Library, at 1555 East Garrison Blvd., is across the street from the Schiele Museum. Its services include bestsellers, audiobooks, large print books, CDs, DVDs, career guides, genealogy and local history resources, a job-search center, online databases, public-access computers, and community programs. 
