

GOOD NEIGHBOR DAY HOW TO BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR

'National Good Neighbor Day' is recognized annually by the federal government on September 28th. This special day acknowledges the need for neighbors to become, and remain, unified through understanding, love, and respect for one another. When neighbors are part of a unified community, they feel part of a larger family where people respect and support each other.

The City of Gastonia will acknowledge Good Neighbor Day and present a proclamation at the September 19, 2023 City Council Meeting. Neighbors from several of the City's Recognized Communities will be co-recipients of the Good Neighbor Day Proclamation. As the City supports and encourages the meaning behind the Good Neighbor Day Proclamation, you may wonder what are applicable ways to bring the Good Neighbor mindset to your community.

The National Good Neighbor Day website offers five simple steps or "pillars" for building cohesive and encouraging communities. The first pillar is **Connection**. Connect with your neighbors by introducing yourself to them. The conversation can start with a simple "hello".

The second pillar of the Good Neighbor Mindset is **Invitation**. Being neighborly involves building relationship with others. Inviting a neighbor and their family over for a meal or a fun activity are easy ways to build relationships. It does not have to include an elaborate place setting; rather it could be

something as simple as grilling hot dogs or picking up a pizza to share together.

Celebration is the third pillar mentioned. As your relationships grow with neighbors and you learn more about their lives, you may discover special days or milestones in their lives. From birthdays to anniversaries to days of remembering lost loved ones, encourage and celebrate with neighbors on these special occasions.

Being attentive to your and your neighbor's surroundings leads to the fourth pillar, **Awareness**. As neighbors look out for one another and keep their eyes and ears open for suspicious activity in their neighborhood, this reliance on each other to protect their community enhances the pride and support of neighbors.

The last pillar of the Good Neighbor Mindset is **Availability**. This important pillar reminds neighbors that being available and accessible when others in your community truly need you is one the most meaningful aspects of being a good neighbor.

How can using these pillars impact your neighborhood?

BEING A NEIGHBOR TO YOUR ENVIRONMENT

Being neighborly to those who live around us is very important. Treating others with kindness and respect is part of our responsibility of being good neighbors. In the same way, we should also have a neighborly attitude toward our environment and our community's ecosystem. By coming together as a community and joining efforts to enhance your neighborhood's environment, you can build bonds with neighbors, generate community pride, and help sustain your neighborhood's natural beauty.

As autumn approaches and the temperature begins to cool from the heat of summer, this is a great time to be outdoors, enjoy time with others, and make a lasting impact on your environment. Here are just a few ideas of how we can be neighborly with our community members and towards our environment.

Establish a Community Cleanup Event: With a little bit of effort, neighbors can work together to plan a community cleanup event. With the partnership with Keep Gastonia Beautiful, all the needed supplies (trash bags, vests, gloves, etc.) for a cleanup can be provided at no charge. Once a date has been established, invite all of your neighbors to come together and make an immediate difference in your community.

Plant a Pollinator Garden: One way that you can contribute toward a healthy environment is planting a pollinator garden. Autumn is a great time to begin planting seeds of native plant species. Pollinators, such as bees, butterflies and birds, will be

able to use and spread the pollen from these plants in the spring time.

GATHER YOUR NEIGHBORS AND ENHANACE YOUR COMMUNITY'S ENVIRONMENT

Participate in a Local Riversweep or Creek Cleanup: Many of Gastonia's neighborhoods are established near a waterway. Over time, these creek beds can become polluted with litter and other debris, and some attention is needed to help keep the waterway clear and healthy. Keep Gastonia Beautiful and the Catawba Riverkeepers are sponsoring two Gastonia creek cleanup projects on October 7th. Gather your neighbors and register for one of these creek cleanups. Plant Trees: The Fall is an ideal time to plant trees in your yard or throughout your community. Trees absorb carbon dioxide gas and produce oxygen, which is essential for life. After receiving proper permissions and confirming that the tree plant site is not conflicting with underground utilities, neighbors can come together and help each other plant trees in the community.

There are many ways that neighbors can come together and care for their community's environment. While working toward these environmental common goals, community members can grow closer, relationally, in the process.
