

Proclamation

- WHEREAS, In 1872 J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees, which is now called **Arbor Day** and was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and
- **WHEREAS,** 2018 is the **146**th **anniversary** of **Arbor Day** which is now observed throughout the nation and world; and
- **WHEREAS,** trees can reduce the erosion of our topsoil, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate temperatures, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and
- **WHEREAS,** not only are trees a renewable resource, they also increases property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas and beautify our community; and
- **WHEREAS,** because of Keep Gastonia Beautiful's observance of **Arbor Day** each year, Gastonia has been named Tree City USA for our 17th year.
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Walker E. Reid III, Mayor, and the City Council of the City of Gastonia do hereby proclaim **March 16, 2018** as

Arbor Day

and support **Keep Gastonia Beautiful Arbor Day Celebration** and urge all citizens to celebrate **Arbor Day** by supporting the efforts to protect our trees and woodlands, and

FURTHER, encourage all citizens to plant trees in Gastonia for our future generations.
