

Proclamation

- **WHEREAS,** In 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees, which is now called **Arbor Day** and was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and
- **WHEREAS,** 2021 is the **149**th **anniversary** of **Arbor Day** which is now observed throughout the nation and world; and
- **WHEREAS**, trees can reduce the erosion of our topsoil, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate temperatures, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and
- **WHEREAS**, not only are trees a renewable resource, they also increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas and beautify our community; and
- WHEREAS, March 19th is **Arbor Day** in North Carolina, and **Keep Gastonia Beautiful** will observe **Arbor Day** across the City, urging citizens to plant trees in their neighborhoods; and
- **WHEREAS,** Gastonia has been named Tree City USA for our 20th year, and on that day shall receive this award.
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Walker E. Reid III, Mayor, and the City Council of the City of Gastonia do hereby proclaim **March 19, 2021** as

ARBOR DAY

and support **Keep Gastonia Beautiful Arbor Day Celebrations** and urge all citizens to celebrate **Arbor Day** by supporting the efforts to protect our trees and woodlands; and encourage all citizens to plant trees in Gastonia for our future generations.
